

CLIMATE RESILIENCE PROJECT IN TANZANIA

Supported by the Rockefeller Foundation

In partnership with the Rockefeller Foundation, KickStart implemented a two year project in Tanzania beginning in July 2012 to investigate how adoption of KickStart's MoneyMaker pumps strengthens farmers' resilience to climate change.

Sokoine University of Agriculture in Tanzania completed a 12-month impact survey of 73 Tanzanian farming households who adopted KickStart's pumps as part of this project. Below are just a few of the highlights from the study:



56% more farmers are planting trees to replenish forests.



170% more farmers can afford and are using improved seeds and



65% of farmers reduced post-harvest loss.
